NOTES ON REGISTRATION OF FOOD PREMISES

Scope of food law

Food safety and hygiene legislation applies to food businesses and food business operators, as defined. A "food business" means any undertaking, whether for profit or not and whether public or private, carrying out any stage of production, processing and distribution of food. A "food business operator" means the natural or legal persons responsible for ensuring that the requirements of food law are met within the food business under their control (Article 3.2 and 3.3 of Regulation 178/2002). In general, persons or organisations whose activities fall within these definitions require to be registered by the relevant competent authority, usually the local authority.

Exclusions

- Activities such as the occasional preparation of food by individuals or groups for gatherings or for sale at charitable events
- Primary production for private domestic use
- The domestic preparation, handling or storage of food for private domestic consumption
- The direct supply, by the producer, of small quantities of primary products to the final consumer or to local retail establishments directly supplying the final consumer
- Collection centres and tanneries which fall within the definition of food business only because they handle raw material for the production of gelatine or collagen

These activities are however still subject to the general requirements relating to placing unsafe food on the market contained in Article 14 of Regulation (EC) 178/2002 as implemented by the General Food Regulations 2004.

Registration

Food business operators must register their establishments (i.e. each separate unit of their food business, which includes game larders and collection centres) with the relevant competent authority (Article 6(2) of Regulation 852/2004). This does not apply to those establishments for which approval <u>only</u> is required (Article 6(3) of Regulation 852/2004).

Food business operators must register their establishments with the relevant competent authority and should do so at least 28 days before food operations commence. When registering, food business operators must provide the relevant competent authority with full details of the activities undertaken.

Once their establishment is registered, food business operators must ensure that any changes to the details previously supplied e.g. a change of food business operator, a change to the food operations etc. are notified to the relevant competent authority (Article 6(2) of Regulation 852/2004). Such notifications should be made as soon as possible and in any event no later that 28 days after the change has happened.

How do I register?

By filling in this form: Registration cannot be refused and there is no charge. The registration form must be sent to the relevant competent authority, usually the local authority. If it is sent to the wrong address, your application will not take effect until it is received at the proper place. If you use premises in more than one local authority area, you must register with each authority separately.

You must tick all the boxes which apply to your business, answer all the questions and give all the information requested. Seasonal businesses operating for a certain period each year should give the dates between which they will be open. If you have any questions, your local authority will help you. It is an offence to give information which you know is false.

What happens to the information given on the form?

The details will be entered on the food premises register and a copy of the form kept on file. This information will be treated in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act and Data Protection Act.
