INTRODUCTION

This Annual Report is published by Conwy County Borough Council in accordance with the CCTV Code of Practice for the operation and management of the system.

Conwy County Borough Council, North Wales Police and business organisations remain of the view that CCTV will reduce incidents of crime and public disorder where cameras are either in place or are introduced. It also assists in traffic management and improves community confidence, thereby creating a safer environment for residents, traders, tourists and visitors alike.

The main objectives of the CCTV System can be summarised as:

- Assist in the detection, prevention and fear of crime.
- Facilitate the apprehension and prosecution of offenders in relation to crime and public order.
- Provide residents, visitors and businesses with a greater feeling of safety and security.
- To enhance community safety, boost the economy and encourage greater use of the town centre/shopping mall, etc.
- To assist the Local Authority in its enforcement and regulatory function. (Specifically in relation to Outcome 2 & 6 of CCBC Corporate Plan 2012-2017)
- To assist with traffic management.

THE CAMERAS

The System comprises of 113 Cameras (reduced by 1 since last report). The 1 public space cameras which has been removed is C76 Lansdowne Road, which was decommissioned due to the building of the new Council Offices. We have guaranteed however that there will be enhanced CCTV coverage in and around the 'Coed Pella' area once the building is complete. All of the public space cameras are now out of warranty and of analogue technology. A Spend to Save business case to therefore improve the service is being prepared. Presentations to Town and Community Councils for funding contributions towards this Wireless Digital HD Upgrade were completed in November 2016, with £82K of funding being promised to date. We hope this promise of funding will assist with securing the project and a

tender process is due to be undertaken around November 2017 with any final decision in the following few months.

A full annual review of existing camera locations and their justification was completed in September 2016 as recommended by the Surveillance Camera Code of Practice 2013 [Surveillance camera code of practice - Publications - GOV.UK](http://www.gov.uk/government/uploads/system/uploads/attachment_data/file/54422/surveillance-camera-code-of-practice-2013.pdf)

For the review, Conwy Council compiled evidence on 8 factors to assist with determining if each individual camera is necessary and proportionate, the results of which were entered into a scoring matrix which highlighted the lowest scoring cameras. The factors considered were as follows:-

- NWP Crime in Area of CCTV Cameras
- CCTV Incidents
- Fit for purpose
- Fibre Rental and associated running costs
- LoS (Line of Sight) future proofing e.g. is camera location suitable for using new wireless technology.
- Financial Contributions
- Operator Opinion
- Public Reassurance

The following 6 lowest scoring cameras are currently under further review for 2017/18 with some being recommended for decommissioning due to showing little evidence of a pressing need.

REDEPLOYABLE CCTV

Conwy County Borough Council also work in partnership to provide a group of cameras available for rapid deployment. These cameras can be deployed to hotspots or areas where there is no public space CCTV available. All requests are subject to meeting criteria and deployments are authorised through the Anti-Social Behaviour Tasking Group.

THE CONTROL ROOM

The Control Room underwent a small upgrade in August 2016 which enabled us to bring in our first High Definition Cameras (for up to 10 cameras). It will be necessary to roll out further upgrades across the system as we expand our HD camera network and replace analogue technology.

The CCTV Control Room is also included in the current Office Accommodation Strategy with a relocation now planned for November 2018. The new CCTV Control Room will be built to the required specification for an Alarm Receiving Centre (ARC) Cat II. This will assist with future proofing the CCTV Service by enabling us to increase our income by becoming a monitoring centre for building alarms.

STAFFING

Following full staff consultation March 2016, staffing levels were reduced from 8 full time operator posts to 6 part time operator posts of 28hrs each with the fulltime manager remaining. The calculations were based on achieving maximum savings and maintaining a 24/7 service with minimum staffing levels. This has been successful but the service will remain at risk in the event of long term sickness or similar circumstances.

All Staff are licensed by the Security Industry Authority (SIA) and all staff have passed Non Police Personnel Vetting, this is a requirement to enable us to continue using the North Wales Police airwave radios.

NEWS

- Conwy CCTV were delighted to be one of the first public space control rooms nationally to have qualified for the Surveillance Camera Commissioners Certification of Compliance.

- The Public Space CCTV Department have been awarded Single Point of Contact Status (SPOC) by SLT for all CCTV and Surveillance Systems under Conwy County Borough Council control, this will involve initiating a full programme of works to ensure building schemes, body worn video etc. will be managed to the correct standards, ensuring Data Protection compliance.

STATISTICS 2016 - 2017

The following statistics detail the number of incidents recorded by CCTV Operators. There were **7049** CCTV incidents last year, **861** of these incidents related to site monitoring. However it should be noted that these are CCTV incidents and are not necessarily recorded crime.

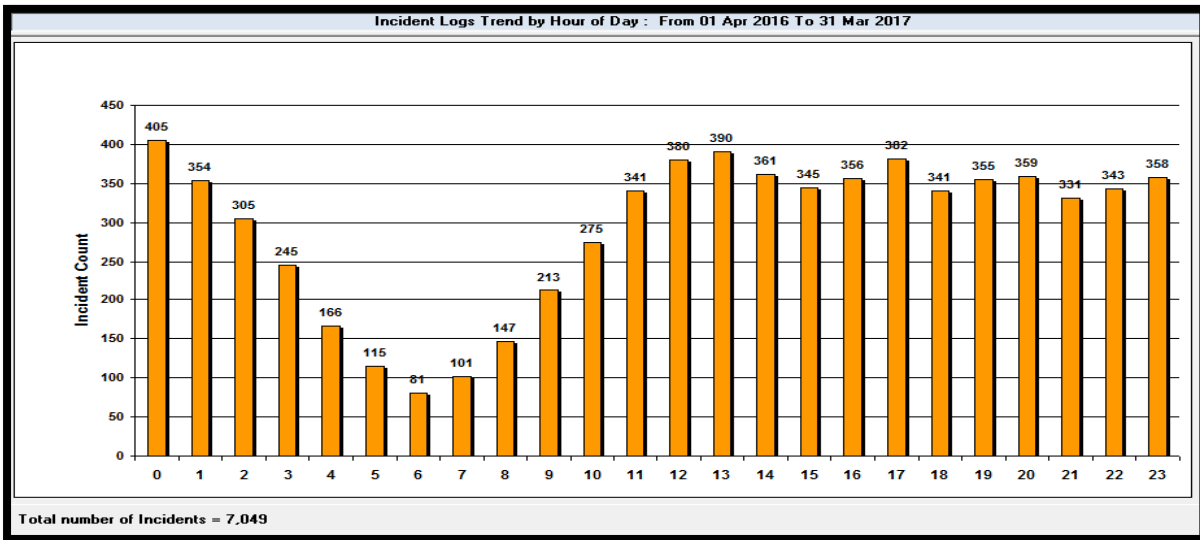
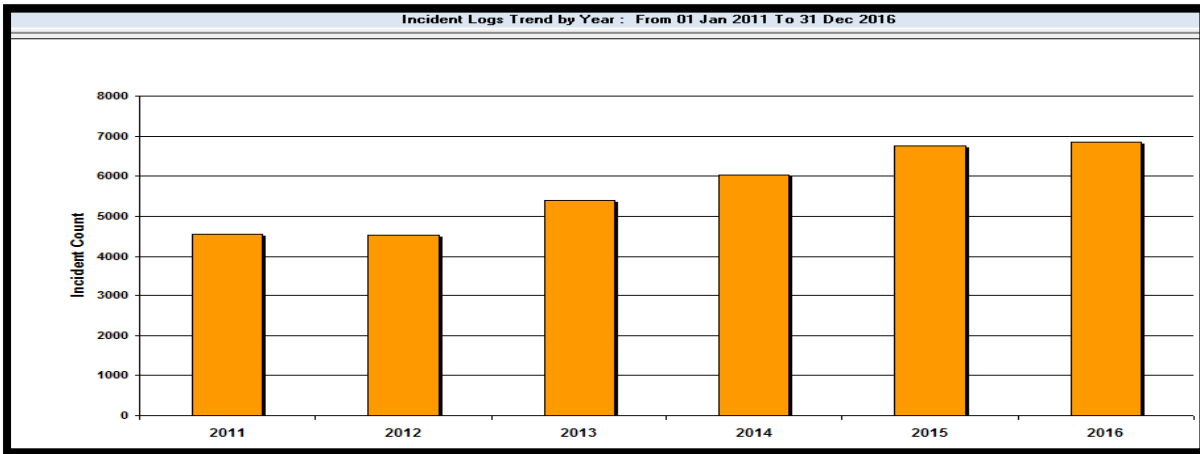
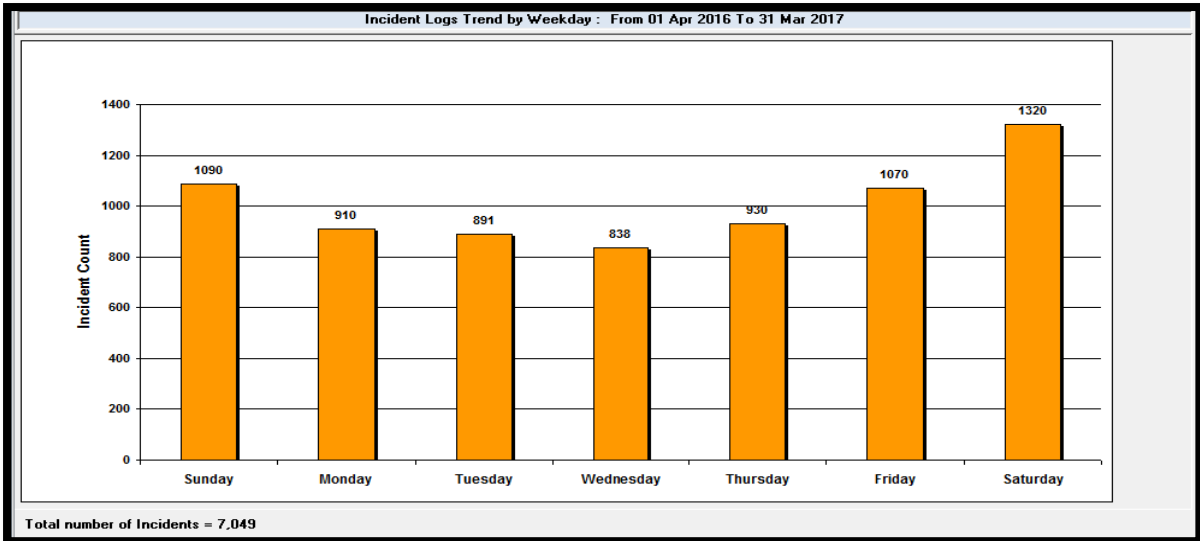
E.g. an operator monitors a dog fouling and passes information to an Environmental Enforcement Officer, a Pubwatch Radio Link User requests CCTV to monitor a drunk male, CCTV requests police to attend and suitable advice is given by officers.

You will notice on the Incident Log Trend Chart by year that the Control Room is becoming busier year on year this is despite operating with a reducing team of operators which is a credit to them and is one of the reasons they won Team of the Year two years running now.
