

CANLLAWIAU'R GRANT GUIDELINES



CONWY EXCELLENCE FUND

"Assisting to reach new heights in Artistic, Educational and Sporting Ability"

- Applications are determined by the Cabinet Member for Education, Skills and Employability in consultation with the Conwy Excellence Fund Working Group at meetings to be held **regularly.**
- Applications are invited from individuals who have been permanent residents of Conwy for the last 5 years or more and who are permanent residents of Conwy at the date of application.
- The fund generates approximately £28,000 per annum for distribution. Grants range from £100 to £800.
- 4 Unless otherwise stated, any grant is awarded for ONE financial year only. It should be noted that application forms will only be sent out on request and not automatically.
- Monies will not be payable for full time/part time course **or tuition** fees, but consideration will be given for one off items of expenditure that allow individuals to develop their skills in a certain area.
- An individual's application shall include a letter of support from school or college tutors and their Governing Body of Sport.
- Any further background information that could be of assistance to the Excellence Committee in assessing the application should be sent with the completed form.
- 8. Applications will be accepted only on the form provided and lobbying of Members of the Excellence Fund Committee will not be permitted.
- 9. All grants may only be used for the purpose stated on the application form and are not subject to any revision during the year.
- 10. The Authority expects individuals to acknowledge any financial assistance granted by the Council in any advertising or literature that is provided.
- 11. The Authority has the right to recover any unspent grant.



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The purposes for which the fund may be applied are as follows:-

- Advancement of education (not course or tuition fees)
- Grants
- will be used to develop further a candidate's specific/practical skills in their field of study
- will not be used for tuition fees associated with a specific full time/part time course
- will not be used for basic learning resources normally associated with a specific course
- will not be used to fund a learning experience that could be undertaken at an alternative location closer to the candidate's home and cost significantly less
- will not be used for ICT hardware/software which may be utilised for other learning/usage
- will not be used to purchase equipment that will then be used for professional purposes not associated with the specific field
- will not be used to support Voluntary Service experiences
- will not be used to support arrangements for attending/supporting interviews
