Camau Cefnogol - Supportive Steps

The extended Camau Cefnogol project will prioritise support for vulnerable 16–25 year olds studying at or in transition to study at Grwp Llandrillo Menai. Building on previous activities, the project will provide wraparound support that focuses on mental health, wellbeing, and the development of essential life skills to help sustain positive outcomes in the future. It will ensure young people remain engaged in education while making meaningful progress in education, employability, and wellbeing. This transition phase will also act as a bridge toward long-term sustainability, strengthening the region's support infrastructure for young people facing barriers to progressing into Post-16 education.

Childcare Works is a 16-week paid employment programme, which helps to address local economic and social challenges, and the recruitment crisis facing the local childcare sector. It is designed to support participants to become work-ready Trainee Nursery Assistants (TNA's) by offering bespoke introductory childcare training, as well as paid work placements.
