CONWY DATA

The Regional Skills Board has recently produced its Quarter 2 Economy Overview for Conwy:

- The county's population stands at 118,001, an increase of only 1.181% on last year. In the next 5 years, it's projected to only grow by an additional 1.47%.
- The total working age population (16-64) is 65,495, of which 16,689 are not in the Labour Force, and of the remaining 48,806, 1,651 are unemployed.
- Retirement risk is high in Conwy, with 55,468 people expected to be retiring soon.
- Jobs have decreased by 3,778 over the last 5 years, and the projected growth is only 332 over the next 5 years.
- Average Wages in 2021 was £22,700, which is £7.8k below the National average.
- The top three growing industries are Administrative and Support Service Activities, Transportation and Storage, and Human Health and Social Work Activities.
- The number of jobs in Hotels and Similar Accommodation has declined by 28%, although Accommodation and Food Service Activities is the second largest industry in the county.

If you are in the Health and Social Care Sector you might find the following stats of interest:

- The total number of jobs in this sector was 6,960 in 2021 and it is expected to grow by only 0.1% in the next few years which is less than the National Average growth of 2.7%. North Wales as a region is forecast to lose 166 jobs in this sector by 2025.
- 22.3% of jobs in this sector were Care Workers and Home Carers, and Nurses at 13.4%.
- The average wage in this sector was £23,050 in 2021 which is less than the National Average of £26,497.

The RSP Report contains data from Emsi's Input-Output model. It is based on data from the Office for National Statistic's Input-Output supply and use tables, Census flows data, UK Business Counts from BRES, and several Emsi in-house data sets.

YOUTH HUB

Having secured additional funding from the Welsh Government's Young Person's Guarantee to help and support 16 to 24 year olds into employment and/or training to develop lifelong skills, we felt it was important to establish an identity for our new Youth Hub, which sits within the Conwy Employment Hub.

The new logo has been designed by Youth Friendly in Conwy, who are specialists in using design, film and media to communicate with children and young people. They firmly believe that all work must engage, relate and communicate for it to be effective.

We are delighted they have captured the energy, aspiration and the positive journey we offer participants, and it also got the thumbs up from their Youth Advisory Group (older teenagers who live in Conwy) who were involved in the design process.







The Young Person's Guarantee is a Welsh Government programme for Government commitment, which is funded in part through the Communities for Work + programme.

COST OF LIVING CRISIS

As we all struggle to keep our heads above water, we are doubling our efforts to offer advice and support to the Conwy residents.

While there is no magic wand to end everyone's financial woes, there are resources to help and our team of Mentors and Advisors are armed with all the up to date details.

This includes support for those aged over 60, Benefits Advice, Disability Support, Family Support, Grants, Foodbanks, and support with household bills as well as Debt Advice and Solutions.

We are continuing with our regular Drop-In sessions around the county and are working closely with Family Centres and Libraries to ensure we are where the community needs our support most. We also held an Information Session on Illegal Money Lending at the end of November to prevent people being exploited. The session was run in conjunction with the Illegal Money Lending Unit which is part of Trading Standards. It has the power to investigate loan sharks, prosecute them and importantly help borrowers by writing the loan off.

Over the years we have worked with many businesses and organisations across Conwy to help fill their vacancies, and we are always on the lookout to build new relationships with local employers, and help even more people find sustainable work.

Unlike an employment agency, there is no fee involved when we help to identify suitable candidates for jobs. Our team of highly skilled mentors and work coaches are brilliant at getting to know our participants, and we pride ourselves on matching the right people for the right job.

There are many ways in which we can help to promote your vacancies;

- We can arrange for a representative from your business to join one of our weekly meetings via Teams, offering the opportunity to talk to our mentors about the roles you are recruiting for.
- We are on the radio twice a week, and again we can arrange for a representative to join us and talk to our listeners live on the airways.
- We can also set up online information sessions via Teams, allowing people to join virtually and learn about your vacancies and discover what a day's work looks like in your business / organisation.

Our Communities for Work Plus Employer Engagement Officer, Clare Kingscott is passionate about helping people to find employment that they will enjoy, and believes this is the key to job sustainability. "When someone comes to us looking for work, it is important to find out what their interests are, and what kind of working environment would suit them. Sometimes we might suggest someone could expand their skillset and undertake some training or take part in a course, and this in turn benefits our employers, especially when we have been able to identify any skills gaps that would benefit the workplace."

"Having a job is so much more than paying the bills. We spend a vast amount of our time working, and going to work should be enjoyable so it is important to us as a team that we help people to find a job that they look forward to leaving the house for, and it is equally as important that the employers we work with are happy with the candidates we put forward."

Outside of work, Sarah runs Shine, a theatre arts academy which teaches singing, acting and dance to school children in Corwen and Denbigh, culminating in two sell out shows every year.



She has been a work coach/ employment adviser supporting residents of Conwy into employment for nearly 17 years and has run local job clubs and drop in sessions supporting people with CVs, job applications and any other employment help required to enable the community in moving forward with their lives and make a difference. Outside of work, Lyndsay enjoys Crossfit, trail running in the mountains and watching rugby. She also helps run a local juniors rugby club which caters for 4 to 18 year olds which is so successful and popular that it now has over 180 players registered.





Emma Thomas was appointed as CfW+ mentor that specialises in recruiting into the social care sector. She joined us in June transferring from her role as a Family Worker with CCBC. She has previous experience as an Employment Facilitator with North Wales Training and as Referral Coordinator with the charity Adferiad Recovery. She is pleased to have secured this unique joint role working with both the Hub and Workforce Development Team and hopes to successfully raise the profile of working within social care by highlighting all the rewarding roles the sector has to offer. Outside of work, Emma is a 'soccer mom' and her free time is mostly given up supporting her son play in his local league.

Sarah Jones has joined the team as CfW+ mentor taking over Sarah Davies' role. Sarah previously worked in recruitment for 21 years supporting job seekers across North Wales and placing them in temporary or permanent roles. Sarah managed a team in Colwyn Bay with a temporary agency workforce of up to 200 staff. She is now looking forward to supporting people to overcome their barriers to employment and help them find a path to their ultimate goal.



COMMUNITY RENEWAL FUND

The last quarter has been busy for the Projects funded by the UK Community Renewal Fund (CRF):

• Community Cooking Workshop
Five fun community cooking workshops focusing on

Crest Course

A two-day course over four weeks with Crest which gave people an insight into various career choices including retail, care/support work and woodworking/joinery while providing skills and work experience.

Family Fun Days

We teamed up with Cartrefi Conwy and Creating Enterprise to offer families from social housing a free family day out at GreenWood Family Park.

Pottery Workshop

Two exclusive Pottery Workshops for members of the Aberconwy Domestic Abuse Service.

Foraging Day

Working with Creating Enterprise, we ran a family outdoor activity day for its Working Families Project. The event was a huge success with families taught the art of foraging and how to identify the plants and fruits that grow wild and provide an incredible and edible feast for free. This was followed by lunch in a cafe and a guided tour of Conwy Castle.



• Employability and Business Admin Skills An 11-week course with Grwp Llandrillo Menai. This was a great all-rounder teaching invaluable IT skills.

Headway

We partnered with Headway, the brain injury association to offer members of the Conwy group a day out on the historic Welsh Highland Railway from Caernarfon to Porthmadog. The trip was an important element of Headway's Art Workshops which got participants using crafts to embed their day's memories.



CONFIDENTLY YOU

Confidently You is another Community Renewal Fund project which is having a major impact on the participants by reducing social isolation, building resilience and increasing confidence/self-esteem through a range of activities and one to one mentoring. Out of a cohort of 41 participants, five have gained full time employment, two participants are volunteering, one participant has gone into full time education, 3 have gone on the NHS Mentor Circle which enables them to have a six-week work placement with Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board, and more than a quarter have gained recognised qualifications that will help them in their search for a job.

If you're visiting Venue Cymru in the next few weeks, keep an eye out for the Confidently You Landscape Inspired Textiles Exhibition. The work was inspired by the landscape of Colwyn Bay, family and friendships and is the result of Cyfunio / Fusion workshops the participants attended which were led by renowned textiles artist Cefyn Burgess.
