Leisure development staff deliver the Bikeability scheme in Conwy.

It's all about gaining practical skills and understanding how to cycle on today's roads.

Level 1 develops bike handling skills and in an off road environment.

Level 2 develops the skills and confidence needed on the roads, preparing riders to undertake short journeys by bike like cycling to
