Building and exhibitions update

Following our newsletter in January the building project has made great progress and is on track for an autumn opening. Those passing the old school site will have no doubt noticed the dramatic changes which have taken place at the developing Centre building. The Culture Centre team is busy working on the interior of the Centre by working up designs for the interactive heritage and library displays.

Our first temporary exhibition will be called People of Conwy and will celebrate the life stories of a selection of people who have contributed to

the People of Conwy roadshows and our artists' storyshops. We have commissioned Portrait photographer Graham Hemborough and will feature snippets from interviews with the people featured.



Conwy Culture Centre will open in autumn 2019 and will feature a new Area Library for Conwy, Deganwy and Llandudno Junction together with the county Archive and Museum Collections, interactive displays and a dedicated community and arts space.

The Centre will be based on the junction of Town Ditch and Bangor Road, Conwy,

Exciting news for outdoor classroom and sensory garden



LDT (Landfill Disposals Tax) Communities Fund has awarded us £44,354, with further contributions from The Thomas Howell's Education Fund for North Wales and Welsh Historic Gardens Trust to create a new accessible and dementia-friendly community garden and outdoor classroom at the new centre. The garden will use accessible paths, seating, and interpretation to support local biodiversity, increase tree canopy cover and provide accessible opportunities to enjoy the natural and cultural heritage of the area. Visitors will also get the chance to use a nature-themed brass rubbing trail, funded by Thomas Howell's Education

Fund for North Wales, which ties in to the sensory garden and wider landscape.

Bodlondeb estate has a history of horticulture and allotments and nearby is the site of the former Cistercian Abbey of Aberconwy; a site of self-sufficiency, medical learning and healing. The garden will include wheelchair-accessible planters containing 'Physic Garden' plants: medicinal native herbs like those which may have been grown by Aberconwy's monks. The project will use these plants as a teaching and therapeutic resource linked to the Culture Centre's wellbeing collection in the library.

The project is a partnership with Incredible Edible, a local Conwy voluntary organisation whose mission is to encourage 'growing your own' and sustainable living. The project is also working with Alzheimer's Society and DeafBlind Cymru to ensure that the garden is an accessible and welcoming space for a range of audiences affected by sensory loss. A programme of events and training will accompany the project including everything from vegetable growing and foraging to storytelling and how to make your own medieval poultice!

Our Heritage Ambassador Programme

Working with Conwy Youth Service and with the Welsh Government-funded Fusion Project has allowed us to deliver a range of culture, arts and heritage courses for young people and adults throughout the county. To date a total of 11 AGORED and more than 60 Arts Award accreditations have been delivered for our young people, with a further 10 adult accreditations delivered in researching family and neighbourhood history.
