Colour sorting

You'll need:

- This can be done with everyday objects found around the house such as Lego, buttons, beads or cut up paper
- · Baskets, trays or bowls for sorting

Method:

- Ask your child to sort the items so that each basket holds items of the same colour
- Your child can also try this activity using tweezers or kitchen utensils to pick up the objects





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The benefits of this activity:

- It will help your child learn colours and counting
- Sorting and matching colours will develop their co-ordination and concentration
- Picking up the items will develop their fine motor skills that will help strengthen muscles in little hands
