Update on guidance for visits to care home services – face coverings

Consistent with the Chief Medical Officer's advice face coverings are <u>not</u> required to be worn by visitors, when visits are outdoors and social distancing is maintained. Some visitors may choose to wear face coverings, particularly if they themselves are in vulnerable groups, however this is a personal choice.

Thank you to all those who have contributed their views to Care Inspectorate Wales on how we can safely enable visits to take place. We are currently working with the inspectorate and key stakeholders on the more detailed visitor guidance and hope to publish this in the coming weeks. I will update you when this document is finalised.
